

**County Health Officer Suspended**

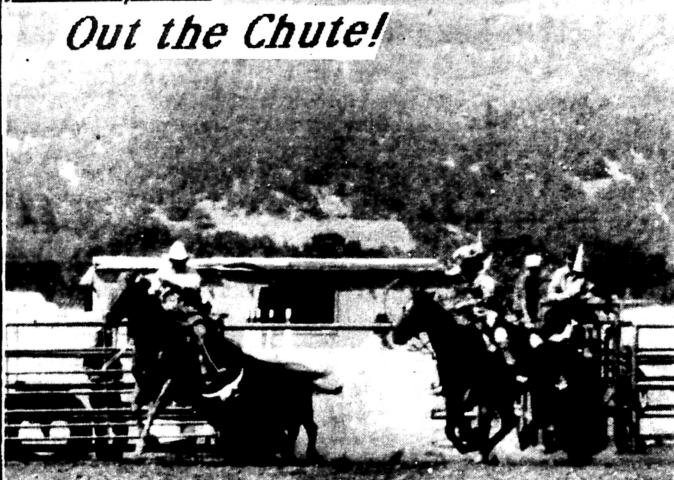

**Bible Bread**

# The End of Mendocino Reservation

George Hanson began to recommend the July 1861, barely five years after its official authorization. His arguments were solely motivated by economic considerations and his plan revolved around moving the few Indians left at Mendocino to Round Valley. He stated:

"It will be seen by making this change it will not increase but diminish the aggregate number of employees, especially if reduced to only the Klamath and Round Valley reservations; and then the removal of all the troops, (which in my candid opinion, would only be necessary as against the whites trespassing upon the reservations, and mixing with the Indians,) thereby greatly reducing the aggregate amount of expenses annually incurred on account of Indians, would also materially improve the condition of that unfortunate race, and make the reservation a desirable and happy home, which has hitherto been so repulsive to their thoughts that death itself would to many of them be preferable."

(From: A War Department letter of George Hanson, 1861.)

Hanson offered several plans for the sale of Mendocino Reservation lands. He suggested that the property be advertised and sold in "...suitable lots of 40, 80 and 160 acre tracts, suited to its location and the wishes of purchasers."

In his arguments for the abandonment of Mendocino Reservation, Hanson cited the fact that the land was so exposed to the "... cold coast winds as to be comparatively unproductive." Yet despite this disadvantage, he reported that "... were all the Indians removed from them, the lands would be eagerly sought for."

He also suggested that Round Valley settlers might exchange their land acre for acre for land on the Mendocino Reservation or substitute the value of improvements on their property for the cash down payment.

It is significant that Hanson continually recommended the plan to move the Indians at Mendocino to Round Valley at a time just following a series of hearings held by a California Special Joint Committee to investigate Indian-White conflict in Mendocino County where Round Valley settlers made very clear their strong dislike for the Indians.

The policy to sell the Reservation land rather than to require the removal of white intruders was continued by Hanson's successor, Austin Wiley, who went so far as to suggest that the land remain in the hands of those who were more or less responsible for the deterioration of the reservation. He recommended that the land and mill site, although located on government property which was opened to homesteading, be sold exclusively to McPherson because "... he was permitted to build the mill there under the superintendent of Colonel Henley, and it seems now that it would be unjust to place the property in open competition between him and other parties by the sale of the land on which it stands."

Mendocino Reservation was finally abandoned in March, 1866. Most of the Indians who had been brought there had already returned to their former homes by that time. The few who remained on the coast found work in the sawmills for a dollar a day or were employed as fishermen. Very few went to Round Valley. The Reservation lands were opened for homesteading and first choice was given to former Reservation employees.

## Final Words

The Reservation at Mendocino was not a success. As early as 1858, Godard Bailey, Special Agent for the United States Interior Department, reported on the poor conditions at Mendocino:

"Notwithstanding (its) natural advantages the reservation has not thriven. There are but few Indians upon it, (seven hundred and twenty-two according to the statement of the sub-agent in charge,) and the great majority of these could in no wise be distinguished from their wild brethren. The whole place has an effete decayed look that is most disheartening. I saw it, it is true, at an unfavorable season of the year, but there were unmistakable indications everywhere that whether considered as a means of civilization or a purely eleemosynary, the system as tried is a failure."

(From: A War Department Letter by Godard Bailey in 1858).

Another writer went further:

"... for gross mismanagement and fraudulent practices the Mendocino Reservation should rank at the head of all government failures."



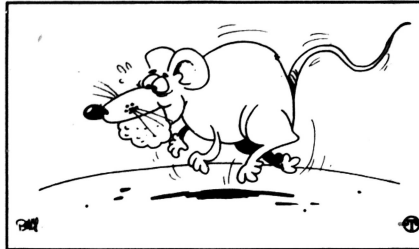
## Lyme Disease: What To Watch For, How To Fight It

The Centers For Disease Control reports that the incidence of Lyme disease more than doubled in 1989, making this tick-borne disease a continued serious health threat to spring and summer outdoor lovers and their families. The disease, which has been identified in 43 states, is particularly threatening in eight states considered high risk areas: New York; New Jersey; Rhode Island; Massachusetts; Pennsylvania; Connecticut; Minnesota; and Wisconsin. Today, it ranks as the nation's most common tick-borne disease.

**Symptoms**  
The consequences of Lyme disease can be serious. Symptoms range from severe discomfort to life-long disabilities: high fever, arthritis, chronic pain, dementia and other neurological complications.

Add to these consequences the difficulty of early diagnosis, especially in children, the difficulty of treatment in many cases, the fact that most cases are contracted while relaxing, playing, or gardening, and the reasons for concern are obvious.

**The Culprit**  
The culprit, Ixodes dammini, a tick, is too small to be easily seen or avoided. Because the field mouse is its primary host—each mouse will infect up to twenty ticks a day in high risk areas—the immature tick spends much of its life in mouse burrows, out of reach of sprays.

**The Solution**  
It was a team of Harvard researchers who successfully found a simple and precise way to reach and kill Lyme disease-carrying ticks in an environmentally responsible manner. The method they developed at the Harvard School of Public Health is incorporated in a product called *Damminix*, an effective treatment which does not affect vegetation because it is not sprayed. It is manufactured by Eco Health, Inc. of Boston, Mass., and works by taking advantage of the natural life cycle of the tick and the nesting habits of field mice, without hurting the mice. Biodegradable tubes containing cotton balls impregnated with permethrin (a mild pesticide) are placed in wooded areas, not on lawns. The mice do the rest.

Happily, the results are conclusive. In high risk areas, each mouse treated with *Damminix* will kill hundreds of ticks a season. Recent tests show substantial reductions, as high as 97 percent, in the risk of encountering infected ticks on properly treated property. To get *Damminix*, visit a local hardware or garden store.
