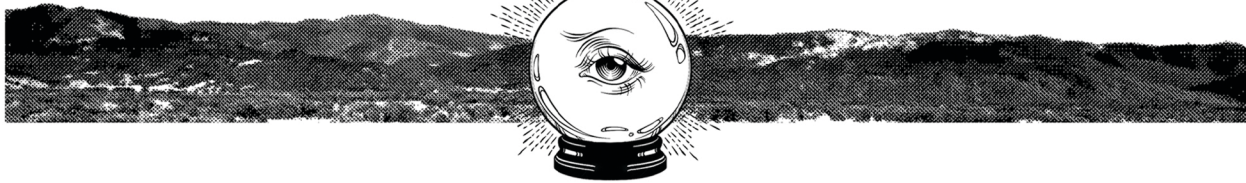
This weekend, a team of approximately 50 students, veterinarians, and technicians will arrive in Covelo for the spring edition of the thrice yearly spay/neuter clinic. Held at the recreation center by the airport, the clinic is a lifeline for the dogs and cats of Covelo, and their owners. Originally administered by Dr. Eric Davis and run through the Rural Area Veterinary Services, the clinic is now part of a university sanctioned student club at UC Davis. The clinic collaborates with Better Options for NEglected Strays (BONES), a local charitable rescue program. BONES founder Barbara Thrasher is an integral part of the clinic; setting up the venue, communicating special cases ahead of time and organizing community volunteers to feed the large UC Davis team during their stay among many other contributions.

Barbara Thrasher, founder of BONES, told me that the clinic is extremely popular with residents of Round Valley, who used to line up before dawn in order to secure their spot on the spay/neuter list. Nowadays, the registration happens in advance. The clinic will serve hundreds of patients over the weekend, with surgeries being performed back to back on Saturday and Sunday, in conjunction with vaccinations and wellness checks. The team arrives from UC Davis on Friday, sets up, performs care and surgeries on Saturday and Sunday, and heads back to the central valley on Sunday evening. The team forgoes comfort and camps out at the rec center for the duration of the clinic. Spay/neuter appointments are full for this weekend; residents of Covelo may do walk-ins with their pets from 8am-2pm Saturday & 8am-12pm Sunday for vaccinations, wellness checks, and free microchips!

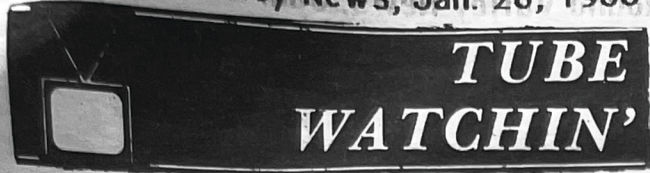
I spoke with Kelly Kohen and Trina J. Wood from UC Davis in preparation for this article, and both emphasized their love for the Covelo community, as well as the integral role of Barbara Thrasher in both the success of the clinic as well as the wellbeing of animals in the community of Covelo at large. Barbara sets up the rec center prior to the Friday arrival of the UC Davis team, organizes food for the weekend (not small feat for 50 people!) and breaks down the rec center once the clinic ends on Sunday. Previously aided by 6 volunteers, Barbara is now joined only by her husband Ron and Debbie Wich, who make up the board for the event. 2 of the other volunteers have since passed away, and 1 has moved out of the area. BONES began in 1998 in Covelo California when a starved, emaciated young dog showed up on the school grounds. There were no rescue options, but someone knew about someone in the community who cared about animals and might be able to help. The dog was named BONES, and was nursed back to good health. Bones lived a wonderful life for many years and his legacy is what is now BONES Pet Rescue (of which he was a founding member!). Since the year 2000, BONES have taken in over 5,000 animals who were sick, injured, stray or in many cases, abandoned. BONES has provided them with veterinary care, food, a comfortable place to live and in most cases, a new home with a loving family." Taken from the BONES website, About Us page.

The clinic is integral not only for Covelo, but also for the veterinary students of UC Davis. The following quote was taken from the UC Davis website's Covelo Clinic page, "Don't expect Covelo to be like any clinic you've ever worked in. This trip stretches you in so many ways and forces you to make the most of what you have and adapt when problems arise. Covelo will make you a better doctor because you are forced to step outside your comfort zone and forgo the luxuries that we've been accustomed to. Covelo Clinic builds upon and adds to the current offerings for students; it is unique from the other current student-run projects (such as Knights Landing or Mercer) because it is a domestic field clinic that involves surgical procedures ranging from spay and neuter procedures to amputations. In this two-day clinic, students are entrenched within a veterinary outreach project that expands their perception of veterinary medicine as a field and their career goals."

A huge thank you to Barbara Thrasher at BONES and the UC Davis Covelo Clinic team. It is truly extraordinary that we can count on having free spay/neuter and wellness for dogs and cats 3x per year. Call-In Tax Program Reviews Changes in Tax Laws

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 represents the most sweeping revision of the nation's tax code in 73 years. As a taxpayer, did you know:

- Tax rates have been lowered and the tax rate structure changed?
- Only 65% of personal interest (finance charges, car loans, student loans) is deductible in 1987, and by 1991, this deduction will be entirely phased out?
- Unemployment compensation will now be taxed the same as regular wages?
- Every child age 5 years or older must have a taxpayer identification number?

Tax Break '88, a live two hour special, focuses on these changes and more.

Featuring an 800 call in number for tax questions, it will air Sunday, February 7, at noon, on KEET TV, public television Channel 13 (9, in Covelo).

Hosted by Edwin Newman, Tax Break '88 features Lawrence Gibbs, Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service, and other guest experts. They will cover individual tax rates, exemptions, standard deductions,

IRAs and the penalty for having an inadequate amount of money withheld.

Special features include a segment on tax credits for taxpayers 55 and older and a new game show segment making graphically clear how viewers should complete forms 1040 EZ, 1040A and 1040.

The dramatic tax law changes will be felt by every American, not only on April 15, but in everyday financial affairs.

Commissioner Gibbs says, "If you are a taxpayer, you can benefit from this program. It is full of facts you need to know now, before the filing deadline. If you wait until spring to deal with the changes, you're inviting trouble."

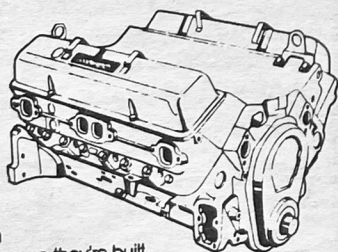

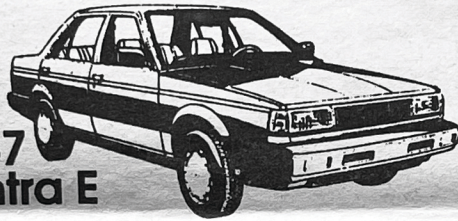
Work has commenced on the Community Birthday calendar. Anyone who would like to list, or if there are changes to be made on listings, please call Florence Atwater at 983-6678.

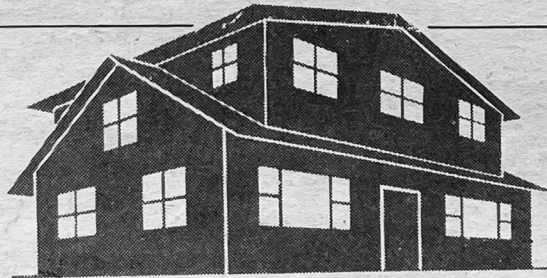

HERE'S A NEW TAX LAW TIP

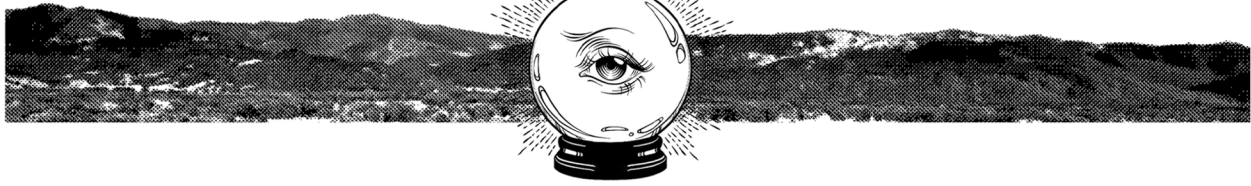
Generally, the new tax law requires children and other dependents to file tax returns for 1987 if:

DAN & KEITH'S: ROUND VALLEY'S VERY OWN HOMEGROWN ARCADE

A local community-led initiative is bringing forth a wave of nostalgia and excitement in Round Valley, as Dan & Keith's prepares to open its doors. Born from an idea among Round Valley High School's teachers and invested in by the community and with grants from county and state funds, Dan & Keith's is not just an arcade; it's a testament to the collective vision of community members who wanted to create a space where residents of all ages could gather and exemplary of that dreamy adage: "If you build it, they will come." Inspired by the timeless appeal of vintage arcades as well as the popular chain, Dave & Buster's,

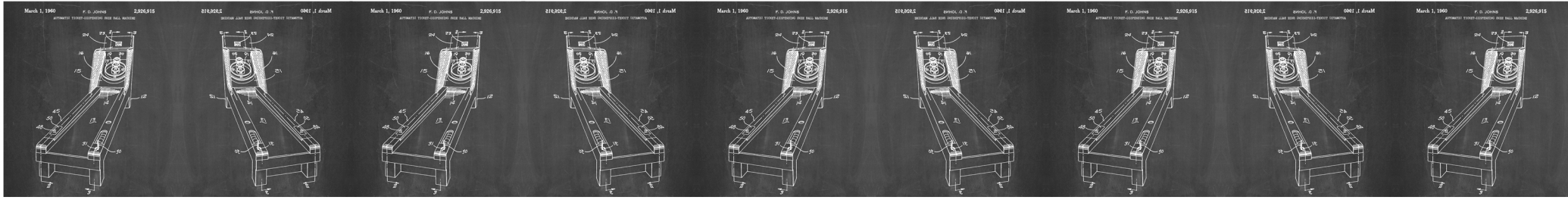


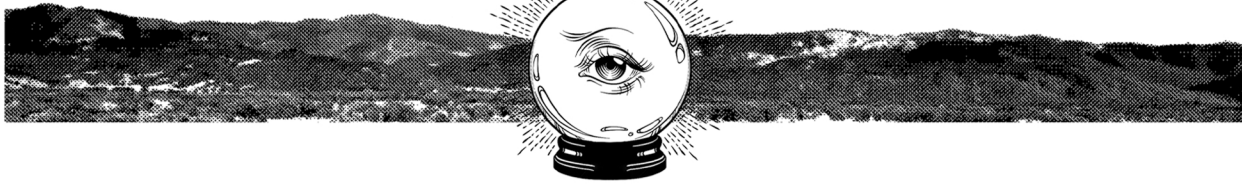
the team behind Dave & Keith's set out to craft an environment made for Covelo that brought together Dave & Buster's, the team behind Dave & Keith's set out to craft an environment made for Covelo that brought together elements of a vintage arcade alongside some fun contemporary gaming. Stepping into Dan & Keith's is like taking a trip back in time, with an impressive collection of lovingly restored vintage arcade games, including classics like Pac-Man, Donkey Kong, and Space Invaders. There's also a vintage Ski-Ball machine wall, so 5 people at a time can play side-by-side, as well as a homegrown version of Whack-A-Mole, Whack-A-Troll, made from old troll dolls from the 90s, by a group of Round Valley High School students as a part of a cross-curricula school project combining woodshop, art, and math, led by Jon Giusti.



The arcade also features a sort of community living room set up with several donated gaming consoles and a large projector so people can gather and play rounds of several generations of Mario Kart (there's a range of Nintendo consoles going from the very first original console to the newer Switch, as well as Sega, and early PS1 consoles). It's a fun cross-generational space, where younger folks play alongside oldheads and there's something to challenge and entertain every gamer. More than just a gaming venue, Dan & Keith's aspires to be a true community hub. The space is designed to foster connections, featuring comfortable seating areas, rotating food truck concessions, and regular events to encourage socializing and camaraderie among visitors. Tournaments, theme nights, and community gatherings are on the agenda, creating a vibrant atmosphere that extends beyond the flashing lights and pixelated screens. Rolinda Want, one of the teachers who had the idea for Dan & Keith's, names the significance of this gathering place: "Having a safe place for our community, provides a positive space for all ages to simply have a good time. Dan & Keith's embodies the spirit of our town— homegrown, for us, by us. Now we've been open for a bit, I've got all kinds of people telling me about the games they wanna build or restore or donate for the arcade. It's really something we keep all making together." Kahlo Stout, a Covelo teenager, enthusiastically shares his thoughts on the opening of Dan & Keith's: "The arcade is so fun! It's not just about the games—it's about hanging out with my friends. And beating them at all the games..."

Adding to the community spirit at Dan & Keith's, every month the arcade is dedicated to giving back to the community, with a special free night of gaming for kids who have achieved a semester of perfect attendance at school. It's a token of appreciation for their dedication and hard work, providing a fun-filled evening where they can enjoy the arcade without any cost. For the grown-ups in the community, Dan & Keith's introduces a weekly 21 and over night, offering a more mature and laid-back atmosphere. Every Thursday night, the arcade transforms into a lively venue with karaoke and a light bar (no hard liquor, just wine and beer). It's a perfect opportunity for adults to unwind, showcase their vocal talents (or lack thereof!), and enjoy the company of friends in a vibrant, adult-friendly environment. This initiative not only adds variety to the arcade's offerings but also reinforces its commitment to being a space for everyone in the community, regardless of age. Dan & Keith's is not just an arcade; it's a lively, safe hub where locals can come together and have a good time.


